Kickboxing

Kickboxing is not a glamorous sport. Its coverage is confined mainly to late-night cable TV, and its venues tend to be dingy sports halls with spartan facilities. **0** (.E..)

Kickboxing is, however, a respectable martial art and most kickboxers are well-balanced, dedicated athletes. **11** (.....) Kickboxing badly needs someone to revamp its image and the first who should be signed up is Catherine Brown.

12 (.....) With her girlish smile and pixie features, pink skin and hair scraped back in a ponytail, Ms Brown could pass for seventeen but has just turned twenty-four. Even her hands, which are long and slim, seem unsuited to boxing. But despite her size (she is only 153 cm), Ms Brown has a kick that could break a bank door. Which is just as well, because tonight in Hastings she will fight Lorna Histed, the reigning champ, for the British Women's Kickboxing title. If it goes the full distance, the fight will last four 90-second rounds.

Kickboxing is a semi-contact sport; points are scored for accuracy rather than damage inflicted. **13** (.....) There is no kicking below the knee, but thighs and ribs take a pounding. Contestants have to "pull" their punches and kicks to ensure that opponents are not seriously hurt: any disabling blow will get the aggressor disqualified. Since there are no weight categories in women's kickboxing, nearly all Ms Brown's opponents enjoy a clear advantage over her in size. "In a semi-contact sport," she explains, "that shouldn't really matter. But it does, because if you're smaller you have to get in close, and they can push you, lean on you, use weight to their advantage." **14** (.....) "I've always had an aggressive streak. I don't know why. All the women in my family wear flowery dresses, but I'm more like one of the boys."

When training she prefers to spar with men, because the girls moan that she is too heavy-handed, that she hurts them. **15** (.....) Her first fight, against a woman some 40 pounds heavier, left her unable to train for several weeks.

Ms Brown's parents won't be going to her title fight. "I don't think my family understands how important this fight is. My mum thinks it's just another silly scrap. **16** (.....) I don't think she even watches the videos of the fights I send her, though my dad does."

HERONS

Heron are beautiful birds. Years ago, as I walked to work in a fish factory in Aberdeen, herons would always bring a little bit of light to the dark winter mornings. Usually there would be a couple of them standing on the river's edge. **21** (.....)

This natural cautiousness is usual in herons. They prefer to spend the day in areas where they can hunt for fish in peace. They seldom allow close approach and are quick to take to the air when they sense humans are about. **22** (.....) This cruel treatment is now on the decline and consequently the latest *Bird Atlas* estimates there are probably twice as many herons breeding in Britain today than in the late 1960s.

23 (.....) This means herons can feed and survive in areas which were previously unavailable because they were either too cold or ruined by poisonous substances in the water.

Weather is probably the single most important factor in the improvement in the heron population. In effect, new areas of habitat have been opened up. **24** (.....) The one of 1963 had a notable

impact, but surprisingly there is little to suggest that the same happened in the freezing temperatures of 1979 and 1892.

25 (.....) As well as the UK, similar increases have been recorded throughout Europe. **26** (.....) And if not persecuted, will even breed in city centres, such as happens in Amsterdam.

27 (.....) There are still numerous threats, mostly to do with habitat degradation, which affect populations on a local scale. Drainage of fields and excavation reduce food supplies. **28** (.....)

The heron lives on fish. **29** (.....) On other occasions a different tactic is adopted, this time slowly stalking through the water, looking intently at any stirrings. **30** (.....) They are such a delight to watch, particularly in the morning when they go hunting in the frost-draped winter semi-darkness.
